Environment News: The year 2023 was bad enough. As we have once again seen, global climate protection is urgently needed. However, there have also been events that bring hope. Deforestation in the Amazon in Brazil is decreasing (although there isn't much left). China could achieve its expansion targets for wind and solar up to 5 years earlier. Vienna also reports the achievement of its goals in solar energy and aims to increase the pace. The Austrian Federal Railways (ÖBB) have completed the first section of the Koralm Railway (the rest will follow soon), and the Pottendorf line has been expanded to double track throughout (relieving freight traffic on the South Line to Wiener Neustadt). Additionally, a new enzyme called PET46 has been discovered, capable of breaking down PET plastic in the ocean. Austria has also managed to reduce its CO2 emissions by 7% in 2023. There is still much to be done, but these examples show that there is hope, and we are not alone in the fight for a better future."

Question of the Month: As is well known, the summer semester attracts fewer new students than the winter semester. Estimate: How many students will enroll for UBRM this SS, how many overall at BOKU, and what is the total number of UBRM students?

Last Month's Answer: In Vienna, for example, the PM10 (particulate matter <10 μ m) limits of 50 μ g/m³ were exceeded at various monitoring stations. The maximum value reached 81 μ g/m³, while the average was around 40 μ g/m³. (Information from the City of Vienna) I do not have good data for CO2.
